Reading Strategies: The Daily Dozen

For students to become independent readers, the following twelve reading strategies must be learned and practiced.

- 1. Access background knowledge.
- 2. Predict what will be learned or what will happen.
- 3. Figure out unknown words.
- 4. Self-monitor and self-correct.
- 5. Make mental pictures.
- 6. Connect what you read with what you already know.
- 7. Determine the most important ideas and events and the relationship between them.
- 8. Extract information from text, charts, graphs, maps and illustrations.
- 9. Identify and interpret literary elements in different genres.
- 10. Summarize what has been read.
- 11. Make inferences and draw conclusions.
- 12. Reflect and respond.
